4 **Sec. 66-389 – 66-418. Reserved.**

5
6 **DIVISION 2 – MUNICIPAL COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL SERVICE**

7
8 **Sec. 66-419. Collection, hauling, and disposal of service established; collection frequency**
9 **generally.**

10 There is hereby established in the City a garbage and trash collection, hauling and disposal service to
11 be operated by the Sanitation Department or a designee of the City. The collection, hauling, and
12 disposal of garbage and trash shall be performed by the Sanitation Department no less frequently
13 than once per week for both garbage and trash in residential areas unless otherwise specified herein,
14 and once a week in all business areas. The schedule is subject to change due to legal holidays or
15 weather conditions.

18 **Sec. 66-420. Collection and disposal service in areas designated to use an approved bag.**

19
20 Garbage pickup at residences located in the City and designated to use an approved bag, shall be
21 provided garbage service under the following provisions:

- 22
23 (1) Each residence covered by this section shall be required to place all garbage in an approved
24 bag, securely sealed, and shall place such bag behind the curb or street for collection. In the
25 case where there is no curb, street, or gutter, bags shall be placed in an area in front of the
26 premises nearest and most convenient to the traveled portion of the street, and the use of
27 which will not block, hinder or obstruct, vehicular or other traffic lawfully using the street or in
28 another location as specified by the Director of Public Works. Where alleys provide access
29 suitable for garbage pickup, the words "Curbside" shall also mean the area in the rear of the
30 premises most convenient to the traveled portion of the alley, the use of which will not block,
31 hinder, or obstruct vehicular travel or other traffic lawfully using the alley.
- 32 (2) No collection personnel shall enter any premises for the collection of garbage. Only garbage,
33 as defined by this article, shall be placed in such bag.
- 34 (3) Bags may be placed for pickup only on the day scheduled for pickup and bags must be in
35 place by 7:00 a.m.
- 36 (4) Garbage at residences covered under this section shall be scheduled for pickup twice each
37 week.
- 38 (5) Any occupant who is a full-time resident who is disabled to the extent of being unable to move
39 the approved bag and who obtains a physician's certificate as to this disability shall not be
40 required to place the bag at the curb. The physician's certificate shall be mailed to the Public
41 Works Director and/or the Superintendent of Sanitation for appropriate notification of the
42 pickup crews.
- 43 (6) Residences subject to this section shall pay the monthly fee for residential garbage and trash
44 collection as set by the City. Where possible, such billing shall be provided by the waterworks
45 serving such residences, otherwise, such residences shall be billed directly by the City.

46
47 **Sec. 66-421. Collection and disposal service in areas designated to use an approved container.**

48
49 Garbage pickup at residences located in the City and designated to use an approved container, shall
50 be provided garbage service under the following provisions:

- 51
52 (1) Each residence covered by this section shall be required to place all garbage in the container
53 provided or approved by the City for collection. Such containers must be behind the curb or
54 street. In the case where there is no curb, street, or gutter, container shall be placed in an
55 area in front of the premises nearest and most convenient to the traveled portion of the street,
56 and the use of which will not block, hinder or obstruct, vehicular or other traffic lawfully using
57 the street or in another location as specified by the Director of Public Works. Where alleys
58 provide access suitable for garbage pickup, the words "Curbside" shall also mean the area in
59 the rear of the premises most convenient to the traveled portion of the alley, the use of which
60 will not block, hinder, or obstruct vehicular travel or other traffic lawfully using the alley.
- 61 (2) No collection personnel shall enter any premises for the collection of garbage. Only garbage,
62 as defined by this article, shall be placed in such container.
- 63 (3) Containers may be placed for pickup only on the day scheduled for pickup and containers
64 must be in place by 7:00 a.m. All containers must be removed from the street by the end of the
65 scheduled pickup day.
- 66 (4) Any occupant who is a full-time resident and who is disabled to the extent of being unable to
67 move the approved container to the curb and who obtains a physician's certificate as to this
68 disability shall not be required to place the container at the curb. The physician's certificate
69 shall be mailed to the Public Works Director and/or the Superintendent of Sanitation for
70 appropriate notification of the pickup crews.

- 1 (5) Garbage at residences covered under this section shall be scheduled for pickup one day each
2 week.
- 3 (6) The City shall provide each such residence one container at no cost. Containers that are
4 unserviceable due to age or normal wear and tear shall be replaced by the City. Residents
5 shall be charged for containers otherwise damaged.
- 6 (7) Residents may purchase an additional container from the City and shall be charged for the
7 price of the container. Any such container shall be the personal property of the resident.
- 8 (8) Any resident placing two containers for pickup shall be charged an additional \$10.00 per
9 month for such additional pickup.
- 10 (9) Residences subject to this section shall pay the monthly fee for residential garbage and trash
11 collection as set by the City. Where possible, such billing shall be provided by the waterworks
12 serving such residences, otherwise, such residences shall be billed directly by the City.
13

14 **Sec. 66-422. Trash and brush collection.**

- 15
- 16 (1) All trash as defined in section 66-387 shall be behind the curb or street. In the case where
17 there is no curb, street, or gutter, trash shall be placed in an area in front of the premises
18 nearest and most convenient to the traveled portion of the street, and the use of which will not
19 block, hinder or obstruct, vehicular or other traffic lawfully using the street or in another
20 location as specified by the Director of Public Works. Where alleys provide access suitable for
21 trash pickup, the words "Curbside" shall also mean the area in the rear of the premises most
22 convenient to the traveled portion of the alley, the use of which will not block, hinder, or
23 obstruct vehicular travel or other traffic lawfully using the alley.
- 24 (2) Trash described as yard debris in section 66-387 shall be placed in bags or boxes, each not
25 exceeding 50 pounds in weight and placed behind the curb or street.
- 26 (3) During the period of October 1 through April 15 of each year, tree or shrubbery leaves are
27 exempt from the requirement to be placed in bags or boxes. Tree or shrubbery leaves must
28 be placed behind the curb or street in orderly piles.
- 29 (4) It shall be unlawful to put trash described as yard debris in section 66-387 in any street. All
30 limbs must be shorter than 4 feet in length and be placed with all tops facing the same
31 direction, in a neat pile near the curb or street. Tree or shrubbery leaves, straw, and grass
32 clippings shall be kept separate from limbs and other bulk waste as defined in section 66-387.
- 33 (5) All empty boxes shall be broken down and stacked in an orderly fashion before collection by
34 the sanitation department.
- 35 (6) Trash as defined in section 66-387 shall be collected Monday through Friday of each week on
36 a day which the City has designated as the day for curbside trash collection in a particular
37 area of the City.
- 38 (7) When the amount of trash as defined in section 66-387 contains yard debris that would exceed
39 $\frac{1}{4}$ of a trailer load, approximately 5 cubic yards or more, or any bulk waste, it requires a
40 special collection. The resident shall call the Sanitation Department to schedule the special
41 collection pick up. For bulk waste, there will be a collection charge based on the current rate of
42 disposal. This rate will be determined annually by the Director of Public Works. Where the
43 quantity hauled is less than a truckload, the collection charge will be prorated.
44

45 **Sec. 66-423. Dumping garbage or trash in sanitary landfill.**

46
47 It shall be unlawful for any person to dump or cause to be dumped any garbage or trash upon any
48 property other than a sanitary landfill, as defined in section 66-387, or the recycling center.
49

50 **Sec. 66-424. Proximity of garbage containers to buildings.**

51
52 Every approved garbage container used for the storage of garbage and trash as defined by section
53 66-387 shall be unattached to any building and not less than 10 feet from any combustible building.
54

55 **Sec. 66-425. Placement of garbage containers by business establishments.**

56
57 All approved containers placed for collection by the sanitation department from business
58 establishments shall be placed as in a location determined by the sanitation department on the day
59 and between the hours designated by such department.
60

61 **Sec. 66-426. Containers required for disposal of garbage and trash; private commercial
62 removal; closed bags to be maintained; placing at curb.**

- 63
- 64 (1) It shall be the duty of every person in possession, charge or control of any premises where
65 garbage or other nonputrescible waste is created or accumulated to, at all times, keep or
66 cause to be kept a sufficient number of approved bags or containers for deposit therein of
67 garbage to prevent the spreading or scattering of such garbage upon such premises.
- 68 (2) It shall be the duty of every person in possession, charge or control of any premises where
69 garbage is created or accumulated, and, in case of multiple dwellings or multiple business
70 occupancy, the owner of such premises, to at all times keep or cause to be kept a sufficient

1 number of approved garbage bags or commercial containers for the deposit of garbage to
2 prevent the spreading or scattering of such garbage upon such premises.

- 3 (3) Containers meeting the requirements and specifications as indicated in subsection (1) of this
4 section and other containers larger than six cubic yards in capacity, conforming to the
5 specifications as approved by the Public Works Director, may be private contractors having a
6 current City of Prattville business license to render such service to commercial establishments.
7 (4) Private solid waste disposal businesses shall only service commercial establishments or multi
8 business, multi dwelling, or apartment complexes that elect consolidated collection in lieu of
9 individual residential collection.

10
11 **Sec. 66-427. Maintenance of access, obstacles, and free of hazards.**

12
13 Where commercial collections are made from private alleys and access ways, the owners and
14 operators of such commercial establishments shall maintain the approaches as to prevent hazards
15 and obstacles to sanitation personnel or equipment. Failure to comply with this provision after
16 notification by the sanitation department will cause service to be discontinued until hazards or
17 obstacles are removed.

18
19 **Sec. 66-428. Removal of dead animals, animal wastes.**

- 20
21 (1) Dead animals of not more than 50 pounds in weight will be picked up by the dead animal
22 crews during normal business hours. All animals over 50 pounds must be removed within 12
23 hours by the owner. It shall be unlawful for any person to throw or put any dead animal into
24 the streets, lanes, alleys, parkways, or rights-of-way.
25 (2) It shall be the duty of those places of business which treat, handle, keep, or dispose of animals
26 to remove all dead animals from their premises to a sanitary landfill under the same
27 regulations as apply in subsection (1) of this section.
28 (3) Animal wastes to be removed by the sanitation department must be placed by the curb in
29 sealed airtight bags.

30
31 **Sec. 66-429. Schedule of service changes.**

32
33 For services to be rendered monthly, and on the first day of each month and continuing monthly
34 thereafter, the following charges shall be paid to the City by every household for the collection,
35 hauling, and depositing of garbage and trash:

- 36
37 (1) Residential charges:
38 a. \$19.00 per unit.
39 b. There will be an additional \$10.00 charge per month, for any occupant placing two
40 containers on the curb or street for pickup.
41 (2) Business establishment charges:
42 a. \$19.00 per month for each business using two approved containers or approved bags,
43 not to exceed a 30 gallon capacity each; and \$19.00 per month for each additional can
44 or approved bag used.
45 b. Business establishments requiring bulk collection of containers, crates, baskets, etc.
46 shall pay in addition to the charge set forth in subsection (2) (a) of this section \$19.00
47 for each 30 gallon capacity container or bag used.

48
49 **Sec. 66-430. Billing procedure; exemption.**

- 50
51 (1) Payment of the charge for garbage and trash service, as provided in this article, shall be made
52 to the waterworks board. Statements for garbage and trash service will be mailed by the
53 waterworks board with its regular billing for water service. Such bills shall be due and payable
54 during the month such service is rendered. The waterworks board shall not exempt payment
55 of any utility bill unless the charge imposed by this article is also paid. Delinquency in
56 payment of such charge may result in the termination of garbage and trash service, and water
57 and sewer service after notice and opportunity for hearing.
58 (2) Any person in whose name a water or gas meter is listed or registered, and whose sole source
59 of income is social security benefits may apply for an exemption from the payment of any fees,
60 provided the household seeking to claim the exemption shall present proof of income to the
61 county health officer no later than the first billing date of any calendar year in which the
62 exemption is desired. The exemption shall apply only so long as the household's sole source
63 of income is Social Security and shall be requested each year in which the exemption is
64 desired.
65 (3) Any person in whose name a water meter or gas meter is listed or registered, who shall state
66 in writing and under oath that such person is over the age of 65 and is on a fixed income,
67 which is defined as living solely on social security benefits, disability benefits included, and in
68 proceeds from retirement benefits, and who is not gainfully employed, shall be granted a \$2.00
69 discount from the prevailing fees for garbage handling and pickup service.

3 **DIVISION 3 – DISPOSAL OF ITEMS NOT COLLECTABLE BY THE CITY.**

4
5 **Sec. 66-459. Items designated; contractors.**

6 Building debris, such as scrap lumber, plaster, roofing, concrete, brickbats, and sanding dust,
7 resulting from the construction, repair, remodeling, removal, or demolition of any building or
8 appurtenances on private property, dirt, stumps, and tree trunks will not be collected by the sanitation
9 department, but the owner shall cause such waste to be privately moved.

10
11 **Sec. 66-460. Responsibility of property owner or contractor for debris caused by construction**
12 **of new building.**

13
14 The City shall not be responsible for the collection and hauling of rubbish, building materials, garbage,
15 trash, or other debris from private property to, during, or subsequent to construction of new buildings
16 of whatever type prior to occupancy. Such material shall be removed by the owner of such property
17 or the contractor responsible for accumulation of the same.

18
19 **Sec. 66-461. Fence companies, tree surgeons, and nurseries, to remove debris after**
20 **completing work on private premises.**

21
22 It shall be the responsibility of all fence companies, tree surgeons, nurseries, or any individual or
23 company doing work on private property to remove from premises all residue and debris resulting
24 from such work. Items may be collected on a special schedule as determined by the Director of
25 Public Works. Charge for this service will be based on the current disposal rate and will be
26 determined by the Director of Public Works.

27
28 **Sec. 66-462. Required license; equipment; compliance.**

29
30 Private contractors must obtain a City of Prattville business license on an annual basis as defined in
31 Chapter 38, Article V, Business License and Taxes. The license will only be issued to contractors
32 having the proper type of equipment for commercial collection. Such license will authorize the
33 contractor to salvage, collect, haul, and dispose of garbage, rubbish, trash, and other such
34 substances as defined by this article, within the corporate limits of the City. The contractor shall be in
35 compliance with Code Ala. 1975, Title 22, Ch. 27, Art. 1 (Code of Ala. 1975, 22-27-1 et seq.)

36
37 **Secs. 66-463. – 66-495. Reserved.**

39 This Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and execution as provided by
40 law.

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RESOLUTION

[To Declare Various Weeded Lots to be a Public Nuisance and Ordering
Their Abatement per Title 11, Chapter 67 of the *Code of Alabama, 1975*, as Amended.]

{Sponsored By: Councilor Chambliss}

WHEREAS, an abundance of overgrown grass or weeds:

1. is injurious to the public health, safety and general welfare by providing a breeding ground and shelter for rats, mice, snakes and mosquitoes and other vermin;
2. may cause the further spread of weeds;
3. may hide debris, such as glass or metal, that could inflict injury on a person going to such property; and
4. may also pose a fire hazard and respiratory hazard; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Prattville declared in Resolution Book 2014-B, Page 151 that the abundance of overgrown grass and weeds at various addresses in the City of Prattville constituted a public nuisance and set a public hearing to discuss said nuisances; and

WHEREAS, notice, as required by §11-67-62 of the *Code of Alabama, 1975*, as amended, was provided in *The Prattville Progress*, by certified mail, and by signage on the subject property; and

WHEREAS, the Prattville Police Department Code Enforcement Officer has inspected the properties listed in Resolution Book 2014-B, Page 151, adopted on October 7, 2014 and determined that the public nuisance still exists; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Prattville held the required public hearing at 6:00 p.m. on November 4, 2014 permitting the owners of same properties listed in Resolution Book 2014-B, Page 151 to present evidence, objections and protest regarding the proposed removal of weeds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Prattville declares that the abundance of overgrown grass and weeds on the properties continue to be a public nuisance:

21 Prattville that Bullet Proof Vests Reserves is hereby increased by \$21,203.00 and the FY2015
22 Budget Line Item Police Department/Uniforms is hereby increased by \$21,203.00.
