Though we have made great strides in combatting this devastating illness, more than 200,00 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer this year, and tens of thousands are expected to lose their lives to the disease; and

WHEREAS, during the National Breast Cancer Awareness Month, we honor those we have lost, lend our strength to those who carry on the fight, and pledge to educate ourselves and our loved ones about this tragic disease; and

WHEREAS, National Breast Cancer Awareness Month educates women about the importance of early detection for breast cancer; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the fact that mammography is the best available method of detecting breast changes that may be cancer, long before physical symptoms can be seen or felt; and

WHEREAS, since National Breast Cancer Awareness Month's inception, mammography use has doubled, and breast cancer death rates have declined; and

WHEREAS, many women still do not utilize mammography at regular intervals; and

WHEREAS, breast cancer deaths could decline further if all women age 40 and older received mammograms at regular intervals; and

WHEREAS, the City of Prattville celebrates Breast Cancer Awareness Month by gathering around the Historical Fountain at Heritage Park to "Turn the Fountain Pink" on in acknowledgement of local breast cancer survivors;

BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH


and proclaim October 12, 2012, as
